## *Baptist Meeting House*

The location at 655 Old Turnpike Road, Salisbury, is open for Salisbury's Old Home Day.

Additionally, Salisbury Historical Society meetings take place here during the Summer. Check our website for details.

The Old Baptist Meeting House, established in 1790, served as the worship location for the town's Baptist Society. Over time, as attendance decreased, the town took ownership, and in 1966 it became the headquarters of the newly established Salisbury Historical Society.

## *Baptist Graveyard*

Located at 655 Old Turnpike Road, behind the Old Baptist Church Meetinghouse, the site is in good condition and easily accessible.

The Town of Salisbury, NH, is responsible for the care and maintenance duties.

## *Hearse House Museum*

651 Old Turnpike Road, Salisbury, is open during the Summer. Please refer to our webpage for specific dates and times.

In 1990 the Museum was opened by our then President, Anne G. Smith. It was her vision to turn this building into an appropriate space to display the town's horse-drawn hearse and the many other Salisbury artifacts collected over time.

## *The Salisbury Historical Society's Scholarship*

The scholarship is awarded annually, supported by contributions from members and donors both within and beyond our community, to meritorious Salisbury, NH, high school graduates. We express our gratitude to the donors for their generosity, which enables us to uphold this tradition.

## *Historical Flags Project*

Our flags, prominently displayed in Summer are likely to be photographed by numerous tourists. The locations encompass Salisbury Heights as well as the South Road Village Crossroads at Route 127 and Route 4.

## *The Round Robin*

Round Robin is a local history awareness initiative organized by the Historical Societies of Salisbury, Andover, and Webster for the fourth graders. This annual event visits each town's Historical Society. Salisbury offers a distinctive cemetery walk featuring individuals interred in the Baptist Graveyard. The program concludes with a midday picnic and traditional games on the Salisbury Town Green.
